"TELLING OUR STORY": VALUE OF HIGHER EDUCATION

College graduates, compared to high school graduates*:

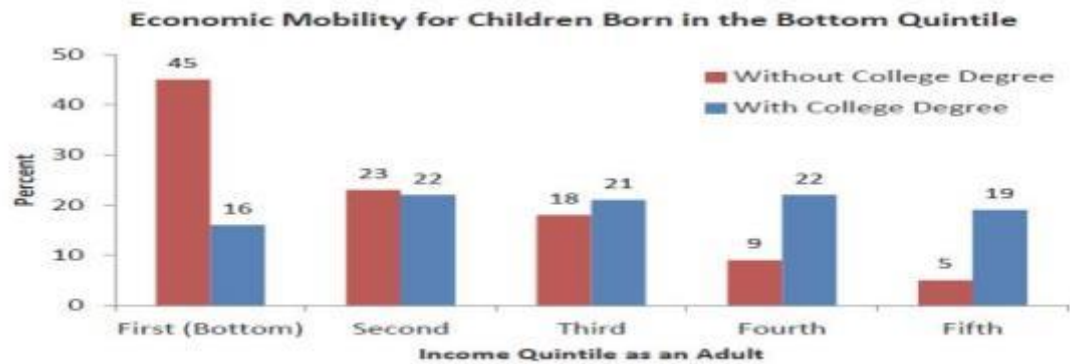
- **Earn 56% more annually**
- **Earn an additional \$625,000 in lifetime earnings**
- **Are 3.5 times less likely to be in poverty**
- **Are 2.2 times less likely to be unemployed**
- **Contribute \$275,000 more in taxes**
- **Are 47% more likely to have health insurance through an employer**
- **Only 4.9% of opioid deaths last year in Ohio had educational attainment of Baccalaureate or higher**
- **Are 3.9 times less likely to smoke**
- **Have a life expectancy that is seven years longer**
- **Are 4.9 times less likely to go to prison or jail**
- **Are 21% more likely to be married, and 61% less likely to get divorced**
- **Are more involved in community, more likely to vote, own a home, contribute more to charity, volunteer, are much more likely to report being happy...**

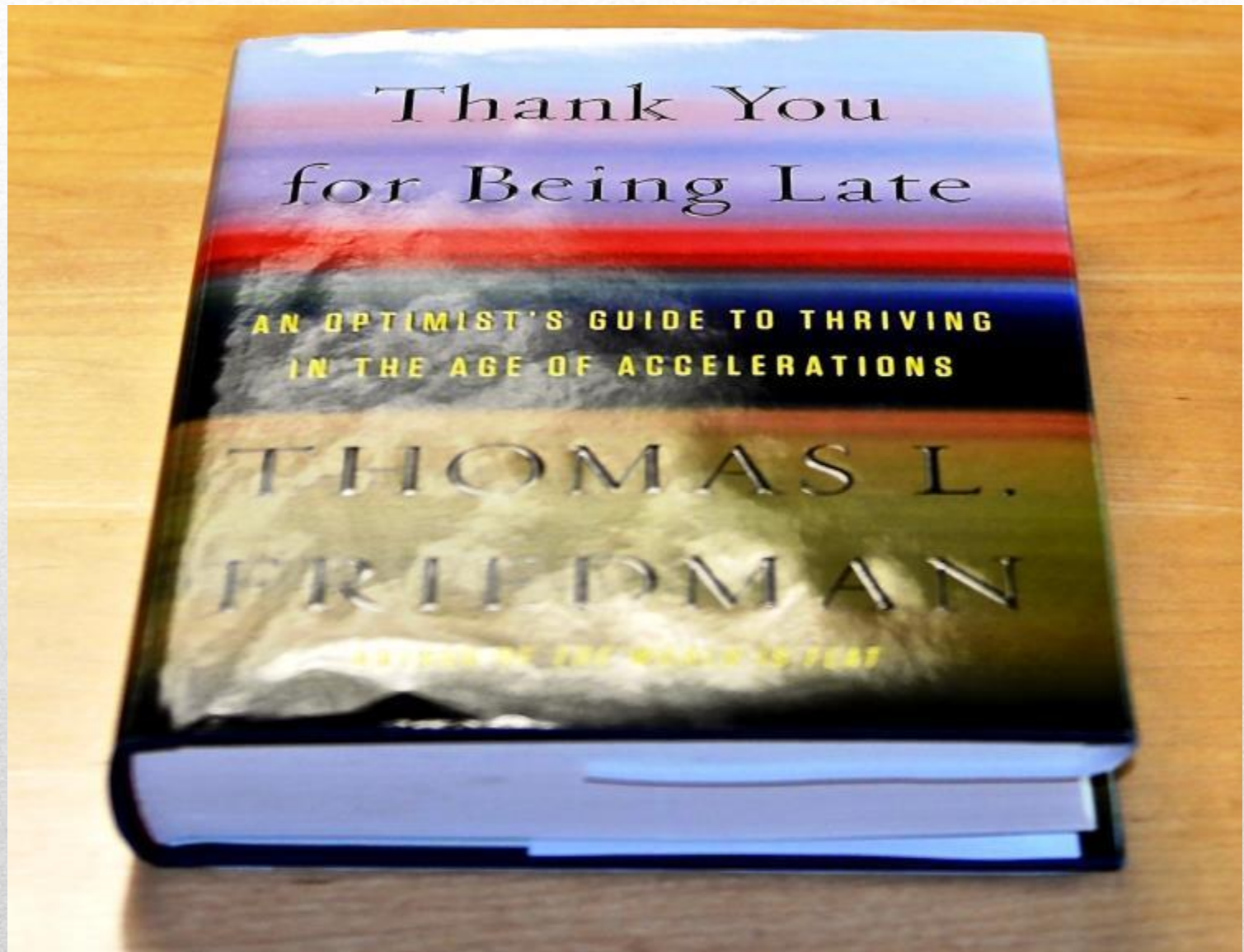

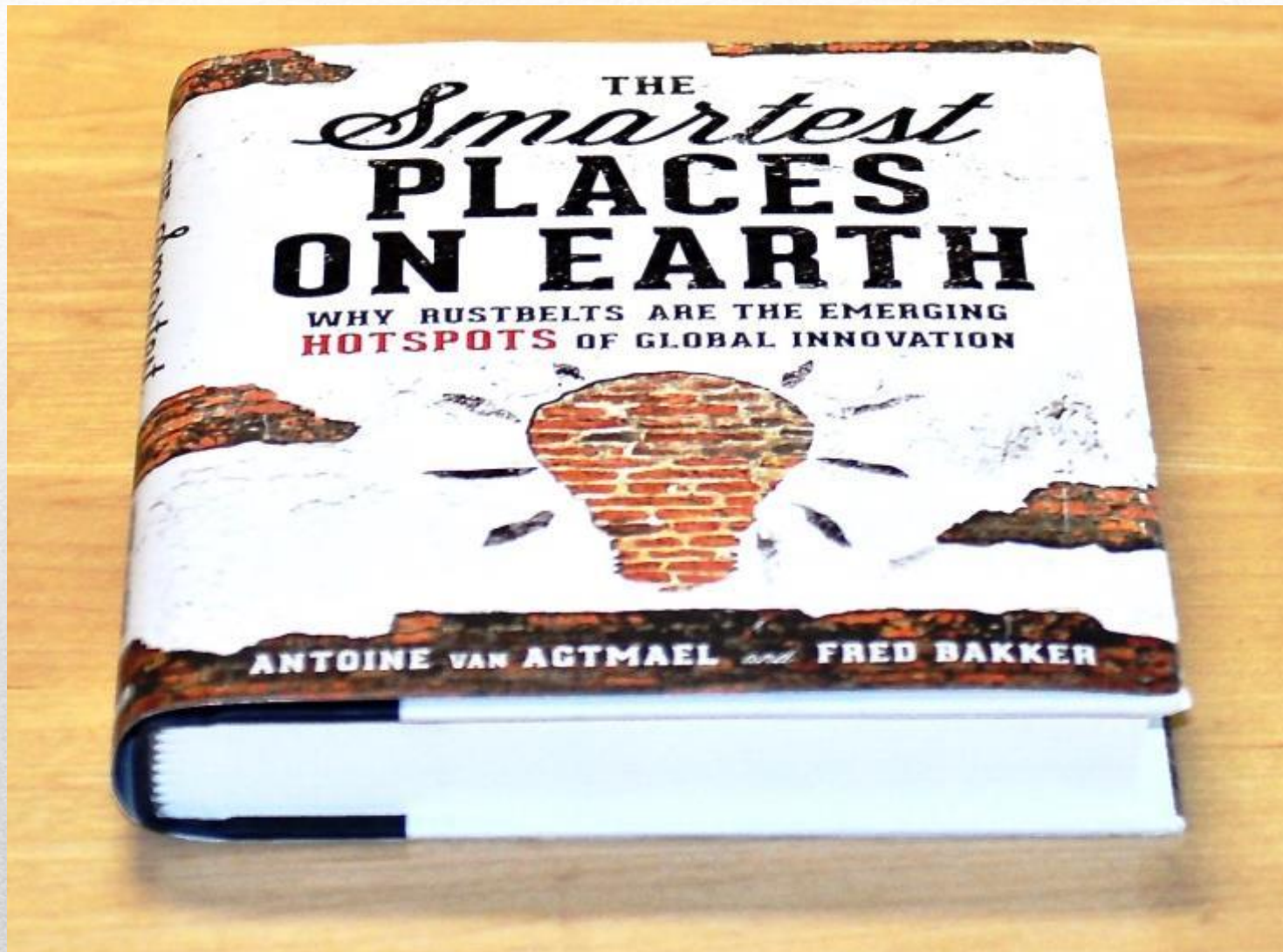




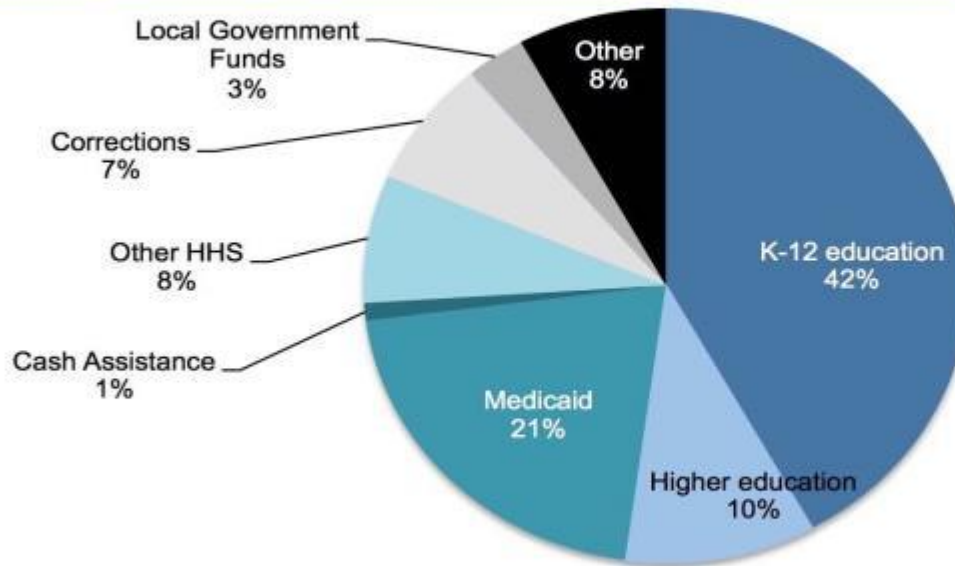


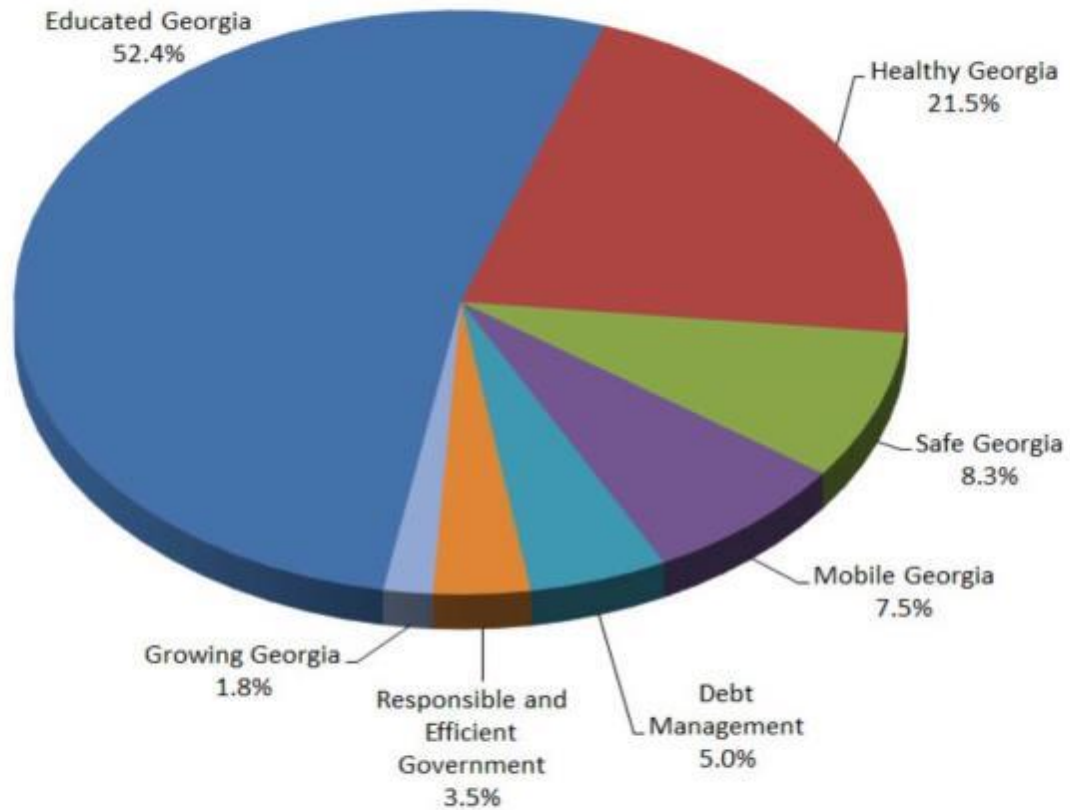


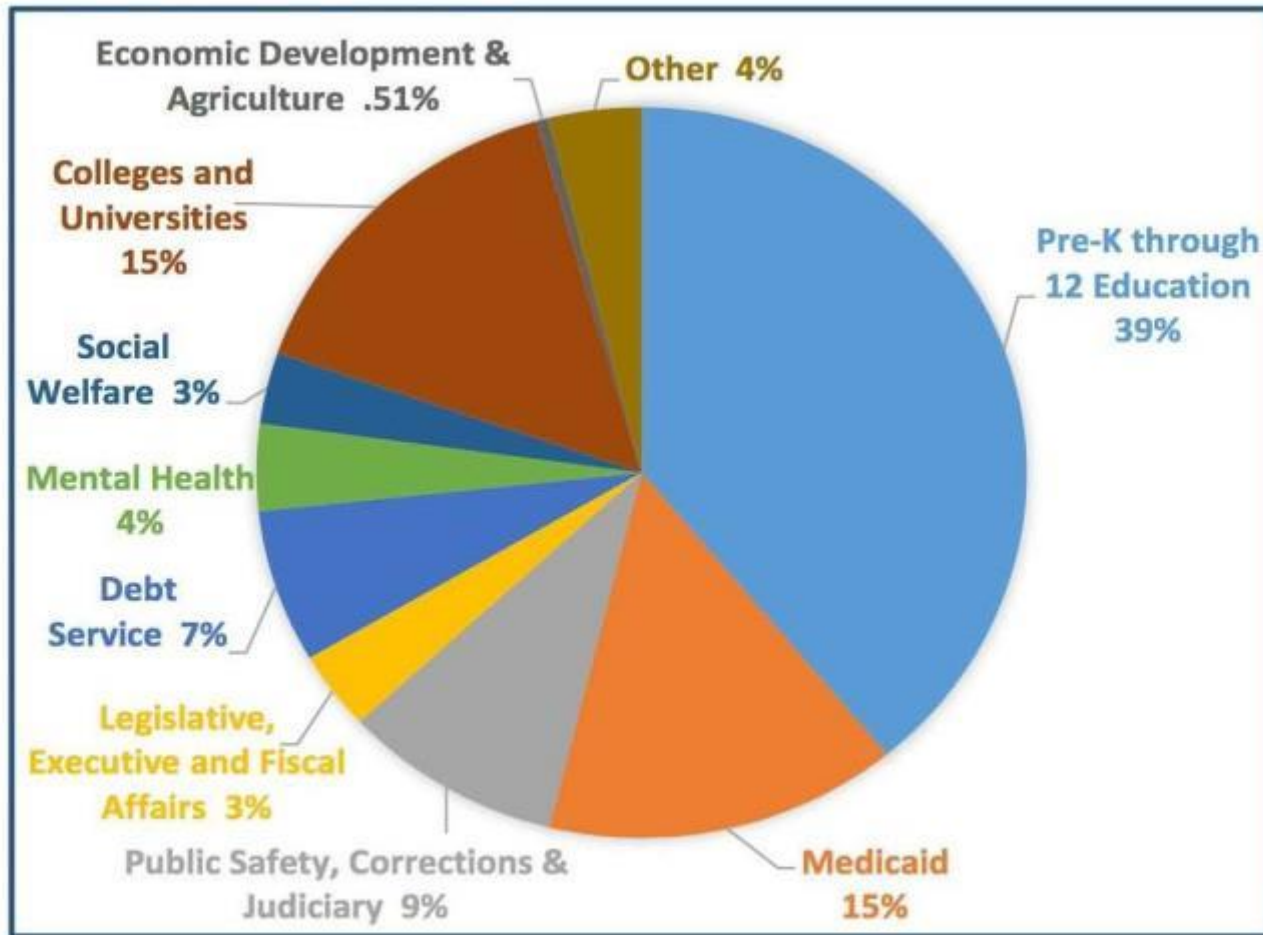




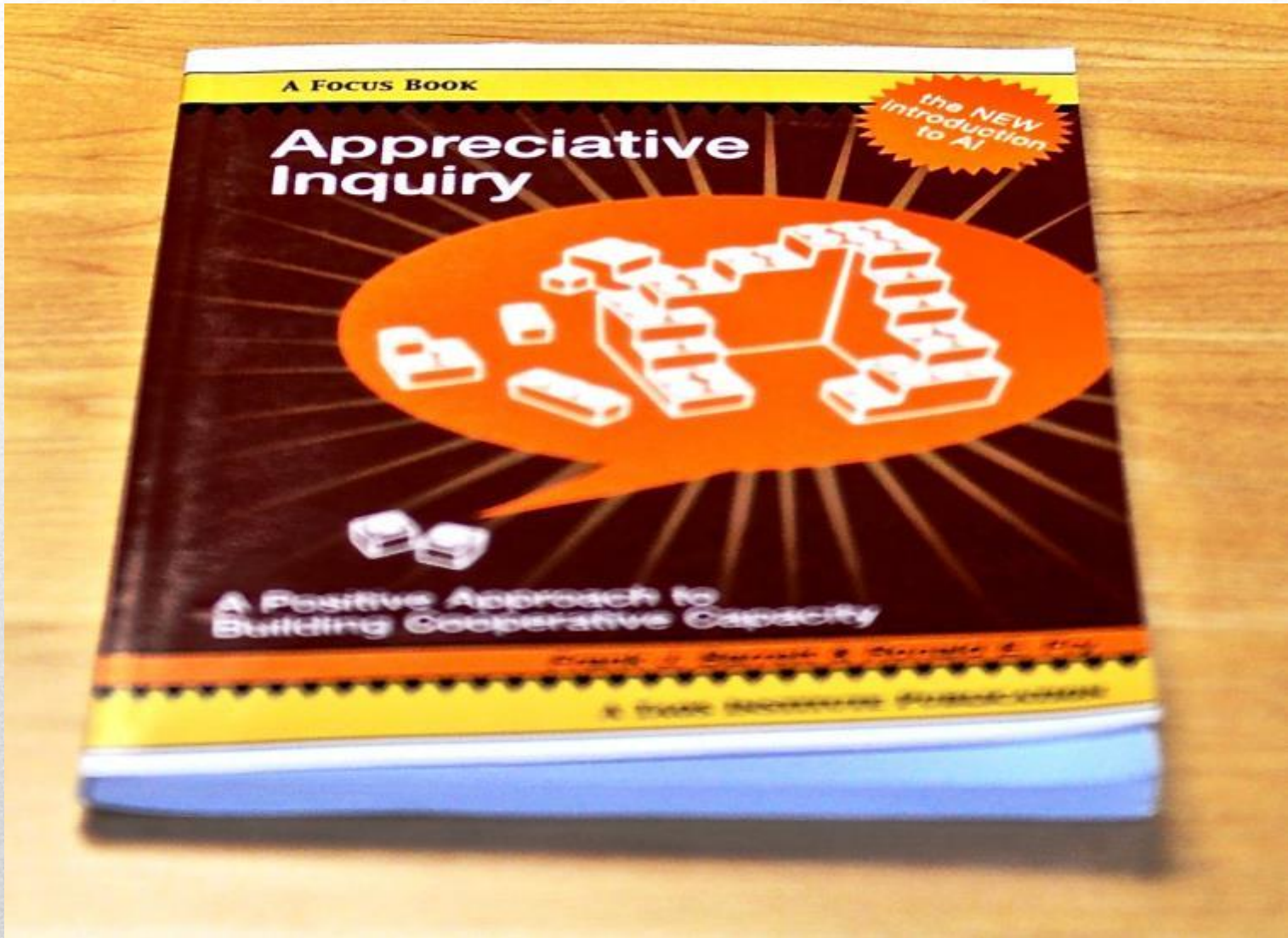
Major components of state budget expenditures, FY 2016-17



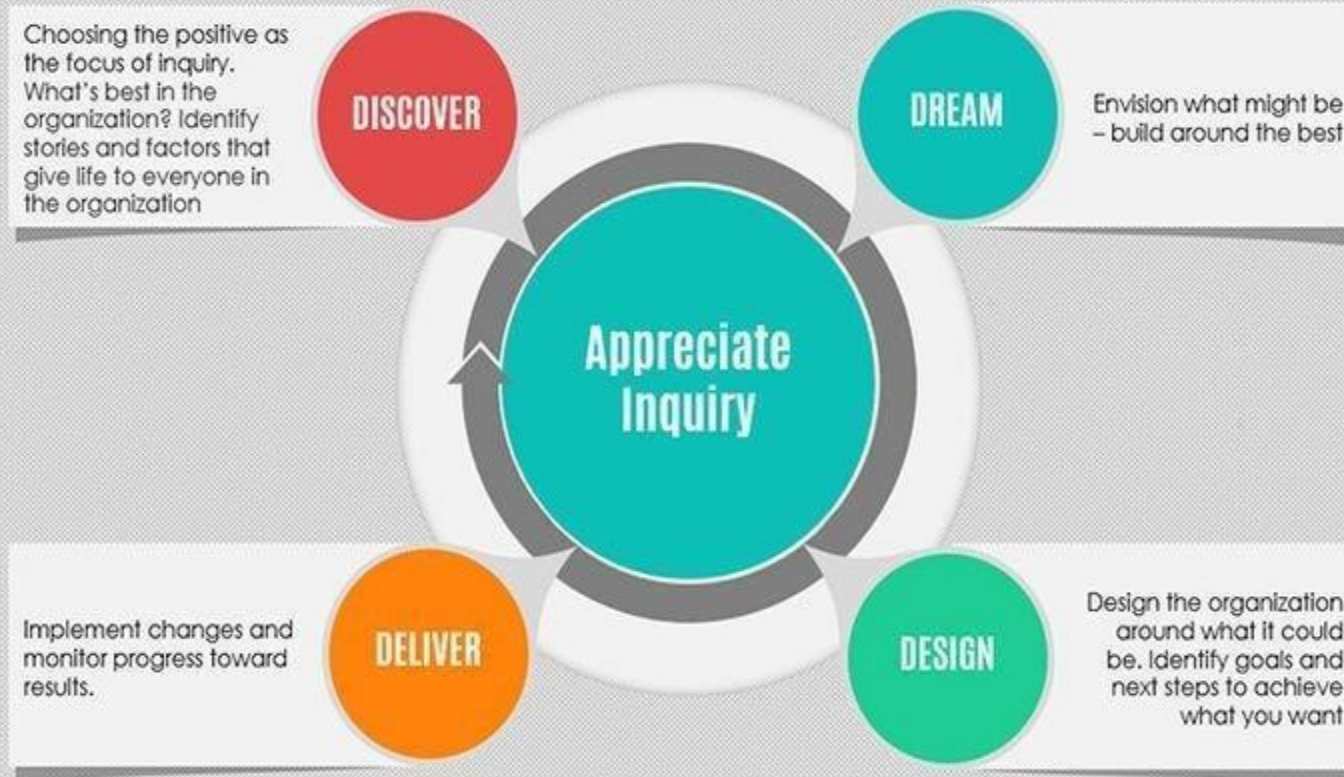

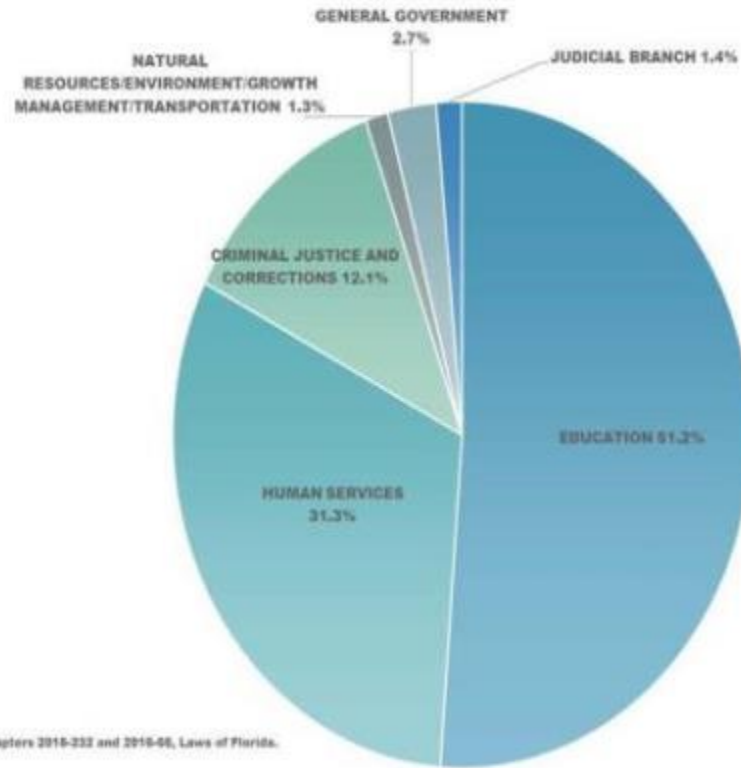

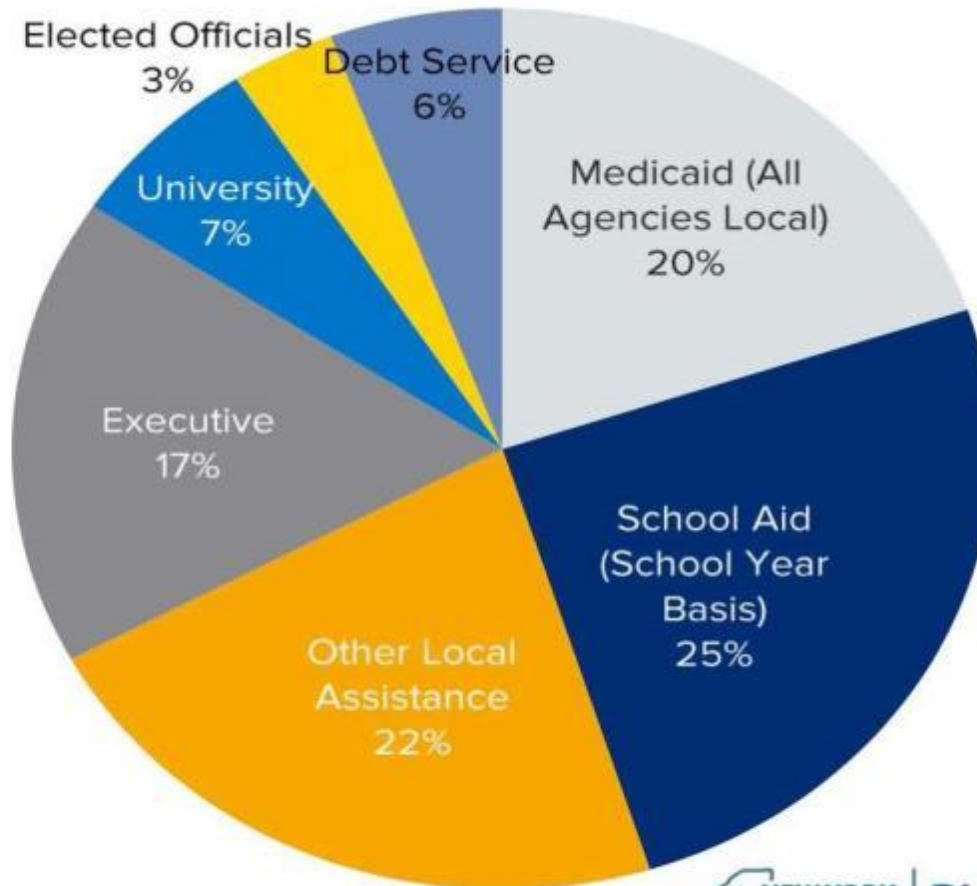




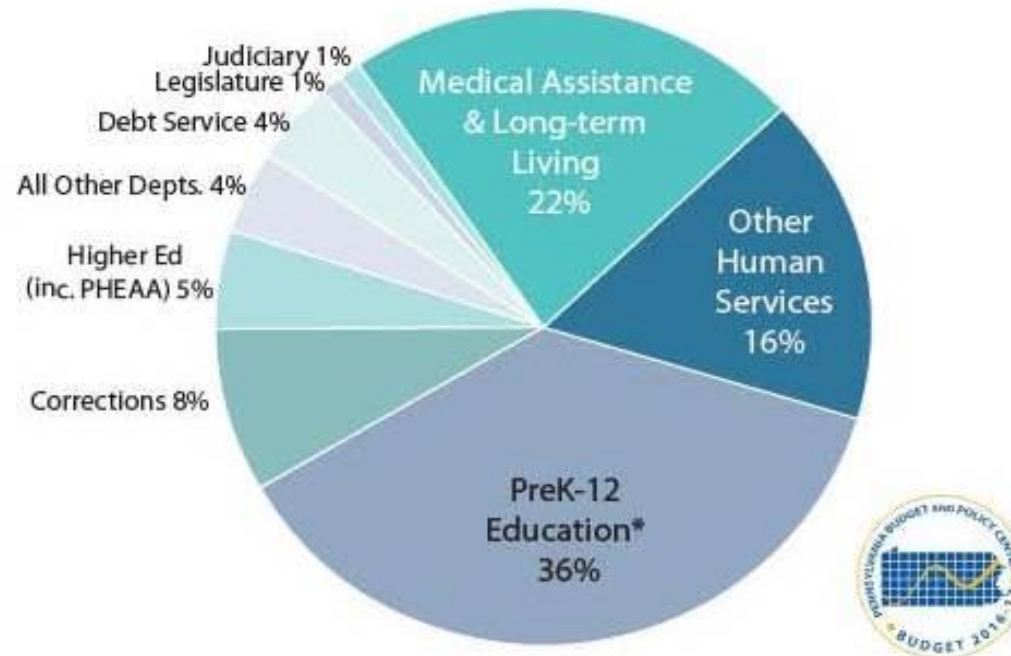
GENERAL REVENUE APPROPRIATIONS BY SERVICE AREA, FISCAL YEAR 2016-17
