Candidates will not be permitted to take the following professional education courses more than twice: EDFN 1501, EDFN 3708, PSYC 3709, SPED 2630, TERG 2605, TERG 3711, TERG 3700, TERG 3720, TERG 3730, TERG 3711, TEMC 3702, pre-student teaching courses: P/PIS preclinical, MCE preclinical, AYA preclinical, AYA/SPED preclinical, student teaching, and student teaching seminar.

STUDENT TEACHING ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for a student teaching assignment, a candidate must have satisfied the following requirements:

- BCOE Upper Division Status and senior status
- a minimum overall G.P.A. of 2.75
- completion of the program prerequisites
- an average of 2.67 in the major/teaching area and professional education courses (each computed separately with no grade less than a C)
- a passing score on the OAE test(s)
- cleared criminal background check – PA will require more intensive background checks.

No other course may be taken with student teaching except as stipulated in the specific program requirements. The Administrator of Student Field Experiences must be notified in writing prior to a candidate's attempt to register for course(s) outside of student teaching.

The Student Teaching Application and Personal and Professional Form is submitted electronically during the preceding semester in which student teaching is to be completed by:

September 15 - to participate in Spring Student Teaching

January 30 - to participate in Fall Student Teaching

Applications submitted after the deadline will not be cleared until the end of the semester.

The candidate must register for the proper number of hours for the respective student teaching courses(s) during the open registration period preceding the student teaching term. Candidates anticipating more than one teaching license should seek advisement from the Administrator of Student Field Experiences and/or Teacher Education and Leadership Studies chairperson.

Provided all student teaching forms are on file with the Administrator of Student Field Experience and the candidate has met all eligibility requirements, the candidate will be recommended by the Administrator to a school district for a placement the semester prior to your scheduled student teaching. Placements can be 40 minutes or 40 miles from the candidate's residence during student teaching. Upon final approval by the district, the candidate will be notified regarding the student teaching placement. **Under no circumstances should prospective student teachers contact any school district personnel with the intention of securing their own placement.**

Time commitment required for student teaching officially begins when the district starts in fall and the first week of the spring semester and ends on the last day of final exams unless otherwise modified. It requires the largest time block (all day, every day, for the entire semester) of all courses in the professional sequence.

Student teaching is a full-time course, which will deviate somewhat from the University calendar depending on the calendar of the assigned school. Mandatory attendance at orientation sessions prior to the University's semester start date is required.
