At a GLANCE

CCP APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

The YSU CCP office needs different documents for your students depending on their grade level and GPA. We hope this guide will assist you as you're gathering materials for your CCP applicants. These documents are, of course, in addition to the online new student application or continuing student form every student must complete. These documents are for applications only, not course placement.

We must receive a transcript or report card for each applicant, depending on grade (see below for specifics).

These documents must include the following information:

- Student first and last names
- School name
- SSID
- Unweighted GPA
- Attendance information for high school students
- ACT/SAT scores, if available

Current 6-8th Grade

- Middle School Report Card
Please Note: Middle school students cannot be admitted by GPA only, even if they have taken high-school level classes.
- Qualifying Test Score
- Parent Consent Form
- Campus Education Plan (*online/on-campus students*)

Current 9th Grade

- Current transcript showing mid-year grades and 3.0+ overall GPA and 2.0+ core GPA
Alternate option #1: Current transcript showing enrolled courses and current report card. Same GPA requirements apply.
Alternate option #2: Middle School Report Card and Qualifying Test Score
- Parent Consent Form
- Campus Education Plan (*online/on-campus students*)

Current 10-11th Grade

- Current Transcript showing a 3.0+ overall GPA and 2.0+ core GPA
Alternate option: Current Transcript with 2.0+ GPA and Qualifying Test Scores
- Parent Consent Form
- Campus Education Plan (*online/on-campus students*)

CCP Transfer Student

- High School Transcript showing a 2.75+ overall GPA and 2.0+ core GPA
- College Transcript with 2.0 GPA
- Parent Consent Form
- Campus Education Plan (*online/on-campus students*)

Core GPA: Calculated using only the student's grades in math, ELA, science, social studies, and foreign languages.

Overall GPA: Calculated using the student's grades from all classes.

All GPAs should be unweighted.

Qualifying Test Scores

Students who have between a 2.0 and 2.99 overall GPA must also have ONE of the following test scores:

Accuplacer
(Two Attempts)

- Qualifying Score: 250

ACT
(One of these scores)

- English: 18
- Math: 22
- Reading: 22

SAT
(One of these scores)

- Reading & Writing: 480
- Math: 530

Admission Testing Deadlines

Summer Start

- *Accuplacer*: March 15
- *ACT*: February
- *SAT*: December

Fall Start

- *Accuplacer*: April 15
- *ACT*: April
- *SAT*: March

Spring Start

- *Accuplacer*: October 31
- *ACT/SAT*: October

Application deadline

Summer start, all students

- March 12, 2026

**Fall start, non-public
& homeschool students**

- March 20, 2026

**Fall start,
public school students**

- April 15, 2026

**Spring start,
public school students**

- October 30, 2026

**Spring start, non-public
& homeschool students**

- October 15, 2026
