Dr. Van slambrouck stated that starting fall 2025 the requirements for external committee members has been revised to the following: "Graduate faculty from another institution or experts in the field of student inquiry who may be invited to serve as members of a dissertation or thesis committee need not be approved as YSU graduate faculty. It will be the responsibility of the dissertation or thesis chairperson/advisor to ensure that these external members have appropriate education and skills to serve on the committee and contribute to the scholarly work being conducted. The external members serving on a committee must have a terminal degree. If two or more serve, then at least one of these external members must have post-terminal degree publications. To request an external member, serve on the committee, please submit the intent to complete a thesis or dissertation form indicating this person as a committee member, a statement of support from the dissertation/thesis chair and a copy of the external member's curriculum vitae to Graduate Studies."

7. Transfer Credit Time Limit Policy

Dr. Fowler reported: Transfer credit policy discussion will be tabled until fall.

8. EDAD course

Angie reported that we were hoping to have all of the curriculum wrapped up, but there is at least one EDD course and a computer science course that requires edits. So, we need to get them moving to meet summer catalog deadlines.

Dr. Van slambrouck responded that she plans on simplifying the process to make it smoother for both students and faculty members.

Dr. Protivnak Discussed the new *Post-Master's Certificate in Counseling Practice*, which started in the fall. The program allows graduates to return and take counseling courses to obtain additional licensure. However, students must get overrides to register for Counseling courses. t
